# 2023 – A YEAR OF PRAYER

Months ago, when I announced my new role here, I spoke about the pillars of encounter with Our Lord: prayer/formation, community and service. We begin the new year with a focus on prayer. This is our starting point – everything – every relationship, decision, action – should come from a place of prayer. In prayer, we give time and space to a relationship with the One who gives us everything. We talk to Him, He listens. He speaks to us and what His will is for us, we listen and respond. The more we can prioritize our time with the Lord in prayer, receiving from Him so that we can give to all the aspects of our lives, the more fruitful and peaceful we will be.

You are invited to create or deepen your own prayer life this year, individually and in community. We will offer opportunities to learn, to connect with others, and simply more time to pray. We begin with our parish prayer found here or on the cards available in the church gathering space. Jesus is our best example of how to pray – with openness, dependence, turning to Him in times of joy and need. We invite you to use this prayer to draw you closer to His heart.

Then, join us at one of the offerings this month and beyond. Our deacons will lead *First Friday Evening Prayer* in the Adoration Chapel this Friday at 7 PM and every first Friday of the month. *Anchored in Adoration* happens on the second Wednesday of each month at 6 PM with prayer, a witness speaker and our intercessory prayer team. On Saturday, January 7, we will have Adoration in the chapel from 9 AM – 1 PM added to our expanding hours. Committing to a regular Adoration time through **stbrendan.weadorehim.com** is one New Year's Resolution that is promised to be successful! Take it from someone who used to only sub, but now has a regular commitment!

Small faith sharing groups are another way to pray in community. Our women's group of *Walking with Purpose* is gearing up for a study on friendship as our men start their semester with *Pray Like a Man Bound for Heaven*, 6:30 AM Saturdays before the sun and the rest of the household get up! New for the parish is a monthly pray, learn and share experience focused on a different type of prayer each month. This month is *New Year*, *New Prayer* at 10 AM or 7 PM on Monday, January 23. Create or revamp your prayer habits and bring your favorite prayer to share with the group. More prayer resources can be found on our Year of Prayer page or sprouting up on our social media platforms.

If prayer is elusive or uncomfortable or you want to know more about who is on the other end of prayer, stay tuned. We are excited to announce the launch of *The Rescue Project* this Lent. Thanks to a generous grant from the Catholic Foundation, you are invited to hear the Gospel like you never have before through a series of seven small group mornings or evenings with breakfast or dinner served, as well as a retreat. It will be an experience of acquainting or reacquainting with Jesus and will change your prayer life.

## WINTER WEATHER ON THE HORIZON

#### DETAILS ON HOW WE MANAGE SNOW ON CAMPUS...

Our snow contractor only plows the lot when we reach TWO INCHES of snowfall. The parking lot is only pretreated if it is not raining (the rain would simply wash it away). The parish facilities team will be responsible for keeping the walkways cleared. When weather is cold, please be careful when walking around the campus as it may be slippery in places.

Parish activities remain open if we are at a Level 1 Snow Emergency, but people should carefully consider whether they can safely reach the campus and attend. If a Level 2 Snow Emergency is declared, the entire campus closes, including Mass. We will alert you by ParishStaq email and social media if this happens. School parents will be alerted by school communications of any school closures or delays. Faith Formation parents will be notified via ParishStaq email communication of any cancellations. The Parish Office remains open during business hours, 9 AM-4 PM during a Level 1 Snow Emergency. If we reach Level 2 or 3 Snow Emergency, the office will close.



## Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God

Written by THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

Nm 6:22-27 | Gal 4:4-7 | Lk 2:16-21

#### **GROW** AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's readings remind us of the central role Mary plays in the story of Jesus and the story of our salvation. We may be tempted to place her on a pedestal – as well we should – she is the Mother of God! At the same time, today's Gospel reminds us she is not divine herself, but human – and she bore the incarnate flesh of the Son of God in his divine and human nature. She went through the sleepless nights and the uncertainties of parenting in all its stages. She learned early on what it takes many of us a lifetime to learn – often in fits and starts – absolute trust in God. As we celebrate this solemnity, we can bring our uncertainties, fears, and struggles to Mary our mother, asking for the grace to follow her faithful example.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

Instead, perhaps we can take the day - or a week or a month - to prayerfully reflect on how we can best put our faith in Jesus into action. How can we witness to our faith in our daily lives? What changes might help us do that? We can ask God to help us draw up a list of ways that we can be more faithful to him.
