

COME & SEE

In the first chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus extends this invitation to the curious, soon-to-be disciples who want to know where He is staying, and what He is all about. They follow Him, invite others, and set out on the path to discipleship: knowing, loving, and serving Jesus.

CHARIS

We are also invited on this path of discipleship daily: to know, love and serve Him through our prayer and formation and serving our community. In Adoration last week, I asked Jesus to provide some guidance on what to offer to our parish in this **Year of the Eucharist** so we may all come closer to Him. The answer? Time and space to meet Him. He reminded me that our role is merely to create opportunities for His brothers and sisters to come and see. He's got the rest of it!

So here we go... Throughout this fall season and *Year of the Eucharist*, we will provide the space and time for you to meet Him here. You have probably already noticed the little additions this summer: **6:30 AM daily Mass** and **First Friday Perpetual Adoration**. Expect to see additional hours when the Chapel is open for Adoration – we will keep adding as the demand grows. Just this summer, 42 new adorers have been added to our roster. Our hope is to add your name and that our adorers commit to a weekly Holy Hour.

We know Adoration can be daunting if you're not familiar. (This was many of us a year ago!) We also know Mass can seem to be routine at times. Yet their center is Jesus in the Eucharist, the most vital part of our faith. Sometimes we need a reminder, a new way to engage. This year, we will be providing practical ways to enhance your worship such as *"How-to-do Adoration"* times in the Chapel and *"Why do we do this at Mass"* moments. The more you know, the deeper you can go!

Our programming this season is also a chance to **come and see**. *The Rescue Project* was a game-changer during Lent. Truly understanding who Jesus is through a lens many of us have never looked through sparked conversions, conversations, and a mission to rescue those in need of Him. We will run *The Rescue Project* again for morning and evening sessions beginning at the end of September.

Both the women's and men's ministries are embarking on *The Chosen* as the study this fall. This weekly small group setting uses the Gospels on page and on screen to experience what it means to follow Him. The series is a beautiful way to bring the Gospels to life and provides both the new and the veteran seeker of Scripture a way to go deeper in relationship with the Lord. The men's group will meet for 12 weeks on Saturday mornings at 6:30 AM and the women's group will meet for 8 weeks on Thursdays at either 9 AM or 7 PM. More information can be found on our website.

This is only the beginning! As we move through this year, more will be revealed. It is our great hope that you **come and see** with us and bring along someone else who may just be waiting for that invitation too.





God is not looking for perfection when it comes to his leaders, he is looking for true and loving hearts. In the first reading, God is not impressed with the master of the palace as a father for the people of Jerusalem. Eliakim the servant has the heart God desires. God will give Eliakim whatever he needs to guide his people – the right clothes, authority, and a place of honor. And we learn in the Gospel that Peter has the heart of love Jesus knows is necessary to guide his followers after he is gone. There are more learned and powerful men, but they lack Peter's faith. Jesus knows Peter is not perfect and he has much to learn, but Peter has the right foundation for the Church. We don't need to be the smartest people or have money and influence to be God's leaders. We need hearts of love and faith, and God will give us the tools we need to do the work.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There is much to be done in our parishes and God needs our hearts and faith to get to work. How can we use our gifts and talents to help make the parish a welcoming place? For some it might be liturgical ministry, but every church needs people to work behind the scenes. Dusting and cleaning the church is not a glamorous job, but caring for the house of God is a blessing in itself. Helping the parish office with special mailings or weekly tasks is welcome to the staff who have so many responsibilities. Why not use the eyes of the Father to look in our hearts and see how we can make our parish a foundation of faith for all our family? We can also use God's sight to look for people at Mass who need an invitation to be more active in the parish, sharing the reminder none of us have to be perfect people to participate. We just need hearts of love.

WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,** "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortionproviding physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 22

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.
