A couple weeks ago, we published in the bulletin the 2022-23 Parish Financial Impact Report – a summary of our financials for this past fiscal year (view it at **www.stbrendans.net/stewardship**). As you can see from the report, our parish is doing well. Your bountiful giving allowed us to pay off the ONE Campaign expansion in just four years. Father and I are very grateful for your continued generosity and for your faithfulness to fulfill your campaign pledges, allowing the expansion of our parish campus to be a huge success. THANK YOU!

In addition to the payoff, your financial support enabled an important aspect of managing our parish. Working with your input, Father, Kate (our school principal), Home and School, and the Finance Committee, were able to designate funds to further enhance and maintain campus capital improvements as part of our yearly operating budget. Just as with your own finances, we never know what can happen in the future, so we try to plan ahead for things that could go wrong and were able to make those types of improvements as well. Through careful planning, St Brendan Parish was able to position and manage **\$490,755** in capital improvements over the last year.

HOW WE MANAGE SNOW ON CAMPUS

Our negotiated snow contract stipulates that our parking lot is plowed only if we reach TWO INCHES or more of snowfall and is pre-treated only if it is not raining (the rain would simply wash it away). The parish facilities team will be responsible for keeping the walkways cleared. When weather is inclimate, please be careful when walking around the campus as it may be slippery in places.

Parish activities remain open if we are at a Level 1 Snow Emergency, but people should carefully consider whether they can safely reach the campus and attend events. If a Level 2 Snow Emergency is declared, the entire campus closes, including Mass and all events. We will alert you via ParishStaq Communications and social media if this happens. School parents will be alerted by FACTS communcations of any school closures or delays.

The Parish office remains open during regular hours, unless we reach a Level 2 Snow Emergency, in which case, the office will close.

"It dawned on me that either we truly were crazy as Catholics in worshiping, adoring, and consuming bread as 'the Body of Christ,' or it had to actually be the real thing. There could be no in-between. This is not a 'This is true for you, but not for me' situation. It either isn't Jesus or it really is, and the Eucharist is truly the Bread of Life. It's a situation akin to what C.S. Lewis called the 'Trilemma': Jesus Christ was either a 1) liar, a 2) lunatic, or 3) Lord. We can't have Jesus as a 'nice teacher' who also claims to be God in His ability to forgive sins, rise from the dead, and declare that you must eat His flesh to have eternal life." – Bobby Angel

"But there were so many Christian denominations. Which one was real? I determined to start investigating by visiting all my Christian friends' different churches. But wait. Why not start with the Catholic Church? OK. What makes the Catholic Church different from all the other Christian churches? The Most Blessed Sacrament. It wasn't like each Christian church was claiming: "No! He's in our box! We have Him!" They didn't even have boxes. Sooo... if Jesus was truly present in the tabernacles of Catholic churches all over the world, then this was His Church, and I needed to stop disbelieving and fighting against many of her other doctrines." – Sister Helena Burns, FSP

"We all have questions that we need answered, and we all need advice from time to time. But when we need advice we tend to ask people who know just about nothing about nothing, instead of going to the man who has all the answers. All the answers are in the tabernacle. Jesus has all the answers and he patiently waits for us in the tabernacle, day and night, to share those answers with us. Next time you are grappling with a decision stop by your church and ask Jesus for his advice. Receiving Jesus in the Eucharist is the ultimate spiritual experience, but there is also something powerful about just sitting in his presence." – Matthew Kelly

Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Gen 15:1-6; 21:1-3 | Heb 11:8, 11-12, 17-19 | Lk 2:22-40 or Lk 2:22, 39-40

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

St Teresa of Calcutta once said, "If we love, naturally we will try to do something. First in our own home, our next door neighbor, in the country we live, in the whole world." In this quote we see a shift from the idyllic to a hard dose of reality: love means sacrifice and service. Perhaps it's worth asking ourselves: Does our family always get our best self? None of us is perfect, so the honest answer is probably no. If it's tempting to think, "well, the Holy Family was perfect, so what does this feast have to do with our family?" let's remember we are celebrating the Feast of the HOLY Family, not the feast of the perfect family. Yes, they were holy. They embodied this in their faith and devotion in those expanding circles of which St Teresa spoke. They gave to God first - in today's Gospel we see the family travel to Jerusalem to present Jesus in the temple. They then returned to Nazareth where Jesus grew strong and was "filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him."

GOEVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

What does this feast mean for us today? It means that being a *holy* family is not unattainable. St John Paul II once said: "The Redeemer of the world chose the family as the place for his birth and growth." (2001) In other words, God's will was fulfilled in the simplest and most ordinary of human circumstances when Jesus was born to Mary and Joseph in a stable. He sanctified what had been profaned by sin. Are our families perfect? No. But are we holy? That is our baptismal vocation and is within our reach each and every day. With the dawn of the new year, let's make an effort to place Christ at the center of our lives. Let's try to love our family members with all our heart, and bear witness in our actions and words. And finally, and most importantly, we must pray with and for one another.

PRAY Family prayer is powerful and transformative, uniting and equipping us to go out into the world each day and bear witness. Pray together: *Jesus, Mary and Joseph, graciously hear our prayer.*
