## **KOLLAR'S CORNER**

#### Dear Parish Community,

I hope you are busy making summer plans to create new memories while enjoying the warm weather, the outdoors, and being with family and friends. We look forward to starting our church and school projects this summer, which will begin June 1 with completion by mid-September. Just like last year, I will keep everyone updated with a timeline calendar in the gathering space as well as on our other communications platforms to communicate what progress is being made and the changes that will be occurring in the summer months around our parish campus. Here is an overview of what to expect:

#### **SCHOOL UPGRADES**

Due to a successful School Auction and with the support of Home and School, the Leadership Team and Finance Committee collaborated to initiate the following school improvements:

School Gym (MPR) Phase One includes extending the school's gym stage footprint (but not to exceed where the current steps meet the floor of the gym playing surface.) The stage/platform extension will allow more space for school plays and will bring the altar closer to parishioners when Mass is held there for liturgical holidays such as Christmas and Easter or for other large events. Phase One also includes upgrades to the electrical, lighting and sound system in preparation of Phase Two.

School Gym (MPR) Phase Two which will take place in the following years will include new stage lighting, improvements to acoustics and a large flat screen monitor that will be installed on the back wall for displaying Mass readings (to be "battle" tested for a rogue sports ball being thrown into it!) This display monitor can also be used as an aid for our school STEM lab to allow students to program scenes for the school plays (like digital props), and may be used during larger Bible studies and during other events that would require a large presentation screen.

#### SCHOOL & CHURCH RESTROOM REMODEL

Thirteen older restrooms added in past decades throughout the campus will be getting a "facelift." In addition, some of those restrooms contain older plumbing and pipes which are becoming more expensive to repair as they age. These pipes will be updated to modern standards.

#### **CHURCH LIGHTING**

The lighting work done in the church a few years ago was to retrofit incandescent light bulbs with LED light bulbs. This was an easy way to instantly cut down on the increasing cost of electricity. But, we had to hold off on replacing/upgrading the housing units for the lights and lighting control system due to the high cost it would entail at that time. Recently, those costs have come down, allowing us to take advantage of the savings that will result if we make those improvements, which include:

- The current analog control system will be replaced with a new digital lighting system.
- The hanging pendulum lights will be replaced with flush-to-the-ceiling mounted units.

The church will need to be shut down in early September for two weeks and Mass will be held in the School Gym (MPR).

#### **MAIN PARKING**

This summer, we will complete the last of the needed patches to the parking lot surface. Once these final repairs are made, we will be re-striping and sealing the entire parking lot to protect our investment for years to come.



#### **CHURCH HVAC**

One of the large air handler units (AHU\*) has failed in the church and will need to be replaced. The AHU is 45 years old. This is the last original air handler from the original build (we have five AHUs in total.) \*An AHU is a device used to regulate and circulate air as part of a heating, ventilating, and air-conditioning (HVAC) system. It is connected to the church duct work ventilation system that distributes the conditioned air throughout the church.

The AHU replacement project has already begun. First, we had to move a few doors and cut through concrete. Soon, the boilers will be removed and the old unit will be pulled out. Finally, the new unit will be installed. The lead time it takes to have the unit built for us dictates that this project will take the entire summer. Everything should be completed by mid-September.

Eight years ago, we had carefully crafted a tactical and strategic plan to keep the church up-to-date and relevant regarding our HVAC, which included the initial upgrades of the boilers, chiller and new digital SMART HVAC system currently in place. As part of that plan, here's what we are planning to do this summer:

The SMART HVAC system we had already installed in our church automatically cools and heats the church based on how many are in attendance inside and the weather conditions. Our system uses very energy efficient economizers that bring in fresh air to lessen the use of heat and cooling of the church and gathering spaces. In the event the outside air is not cool or warm enough, the economizers still provide fresh air. However, they will modulate to allow the boilers/chiller to perform their respective functions. This should keep the church at a comfortable temperature.

But, if the temperatures outside substantially increase during this upgrade, we will need to move Mass temporarily into the School Gym (MPR) which will be communicated through our various communications platforms. We will be monitoring the weather utilizing monthly/weekly/daily weather tools and would appreciate your feedback as well to make those decisions ahead of time. Our goal is to make you all as comfortable as possible during your time of worship here.

On behalf of Fr Bob, Fr Stinnett, Fr Weldit, our Deacons, the Parish/School Staff and members of the Parish Finance Council, we would all like to communicate our thanks for your generosity and support in order to maintain our campus. As always, we welcome your feedback and suggestions as we continue to grow and improve our parish community. ENJOY the warmer spring weather that is upon us and have a wonderful summer!

# Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 10:25-36, 34-35, 44-48 | 1 Jn 14:23 | Jn 15:9-17

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you ... If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love." We don't earn God's love - it is freely given to us. But only by loving God and others, and by keeping his commandments, do we remain in that love as our source of life and joy. It becomes the air we breathe, and the breath we exhale. Today's second reading and Gospel reassure us of the love of God, but also give us a few specifics for how to live in and remain in that love - self-sacrifice and prayer. We are to love one another as Jesus loves us, and we know what that looks like from his life: feeding the hungry, caring for the sick, forgiving one another, and more. Living in the way Jesus instructs is not simply completing a checklist of things to do, however. It's a way of life - to live in God's love and to demonstrate his love with our outward actions. When we do so, we are helping bring about the kingdom in a very real way. It's not complicated. We begin by acting in accordance with the truth that the person in front of us is loved by God.

#### **GO** EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The message of the Gospel is countercultural and upends many convictions about what is true, good, and beautiful. What Jesus says can seem upside down to us, as it certainly did to the people of his time! Even the disciples, who walked with Jesus, didn't fully grasp all of what Jesus had told them until after he had been raised from the dead and appeared in their midst and shared food with them. And even after they understood, they didn't live it perfectly, nor do we. The things of this world we can mistakenly think are important get in the way of loving as we ought, and they shape our behavior and vision of the world. To counter that, we must focus in on what the Lord is saying and what that demands of us. What exactly that will look like in our lives is the provenance of prayer. Ask for God's help in loving all those we come across, even (and especially) those we may not particularly care for. He will answer our prayers and show us the way.

**WITNESS** Think of someone you know personally or whom you know of, who is particularly difficult to *like*. Create a plan to *love* them this week – either through praying for them, or interacting with them in a charitable, selfless way.


